

Anti-Phishing tips for remote working

As most UK corporations are working remotely, it's important to stay vigilant to the threat of Phishing during these unusual and distracting times.



Examine the website URL

If you click a URL that directs you to a login page, take a look at the URL to ensure that it's correct.



Keep passwords secure and safe

Just remember that your IT department or any reputable company won't ask you for a password over email.



Think twice, always

Threatening actors will usually use emotional appeals and will try to rush or create a false sense of urgency. Don't rush and stay calm, look out for poor grammar, spelling mistakes and check if the sender's email address correlates to the organisation in the body of the email.



Most importantly, report it

The best practice when you have received a suspicious email is to report it to your IT or security team. They won't be aware of it otherwise.
